

It Takes a Team











Dunbar's Number

(people who know each other reasonably well)




Who Owns The Stewardship and Engagement Problem?



<u>ADMINISTRATIVE</u>

1. Ministry Team Leader

- ~ Lead all ministry efforts
- ~ Regularly reports to Parish Council and General Assembly

2. Stewardship Communications

- ~ Produce and constantly places ALL communications in ALL parish media outlets
- ~ Coordinate testimonials and stewardship presentations

3. Stewardship Data Analysis

- ~ Confidentially maintain all stewardship data
- ~ Produce all stewardship reports, dashboards, and analyses



<u>TACTICAL</u>

4. Stewardship Campaign

- ~ Coordinate and manages <u>year-round</u> campaign
- ~ Lead Steward Engagement Process (SEP) to personally contact every steward each year

5. Planned Giving

- ~ Lead year-round Planned Giving Campaign
- ~ Coordinate Planned Giving Recognition Celebration

6. Stewardship Ambassador Recruitment & Training

~ Recruit team to personally contact all stewards

Work with Stewardship Campaign Chair to train Stewardship Ambassadors to effectively complete Steward Engagement Process

MINISTRY OR LIASON (these positions exist if no such ministry already exists at the parish

7. <u>Welcoming Ministry</u>

- ~ Coordinate Sunday "Total Welcoming Experience"
- ~ Coordinate Follow-Up "Total Welcoming Experience"

8. Thanking Ministry

~ Coordinate all thanking communications with all stewards

~ Plan thanking and recognition celebrations

9. Youth Stewardship

Develop youth stewardship campaign and materialsCoordinate youth stewardship campaign

10. Small Group Ministry

- ~ Manage all aspects of Small Group Ministry
- ~ Recruit and trains Small Group Leaders
- ~ Facilitate parishioner sign-up for Small Group Ministries

Ingredients Of Effective Stewardship Engagement Process

Plan A - Personal In-Home Visitations

Each steward is personally visited in their home by a Stewardship Ambassador

Plan B - Small Group In-Home Gatherings

Each steward is invited to a small group gathering hosted at a Stewardship Ambassador's house

Plan C - <u>Personal Telephone Calls</u>

Each steward is personally called at home by a Stewardship Ambassador







The wHoly-Engaged Personal Visitation Program

The wHoly-Engaged Personal Visitation Program

- <u>STEP 1</u> Priest, Parish Council, Stewardship and Ministry Leaders reach consensus about your stewardship strategy (PPS)
- <u>STEP 2</u> Reach consensus on the Parish's Mission, Vision and strategic goals and Strategic Plan
- <u>STEP 3</u> Organize your Council of Ministries
- <u>STEP 4</u> Prepare your Ministries Handbook and Stewardship materials and revised Stewardship Commitment Form

<u>STEP 6</u> - Train your Stewardship Ambassadors using these Igniting The Flame of True Christian Stewardship materials, teach your mission, vision and ministries

<u>STEP 7</u> - Ambassadors select the Stewards they will visit based on commonality

<u>STEP 8</u> - Ambassadors call and schedule 15-30minute in-home visitation focusing on engagement in ministries

<u>STEP 9</u> - Ambassadors follow up every two weeks until stewardship commitment forms are submitted to the Parish administrator The wHoly-Engaged Personal Visitation Program Personal, in-home visitations agenda

~ Opening prayer of thanksgiving

- ~ Discuss parish items of common interest (e.g., the top 3 things they like about parish)
- ~ Share the vision/ministries of the parish
- ~ Address any comments/concerns or promise to get back to them
- ~ Review Ministry handbook and stewardship forms
- ~ Explain you will follow up every 2 weeks until the church receives their competed forms
- ~ Thank them and end with a prayer

The wHoly-Engaged Group Visitation Program

The wHoly-Engaged Group Visitation Program

- ~ Opening prayer, welcome/ice breaker
- ~ Dinner and fellowship
- ~ Program
 - the vision and ministries of the parish
 - 2 or 3 testimonials
 - present stewardship ministry handbook and stewardship commitment form
 - explain next steps (including 2-week follow-ups), answers any questions and closing prayer

Stewardship Team

~ Recruit the number of "Ambassadors" that is a little over 10% of your number of steward units

~ Each Ambassador takes care of themselves and 9 other steward units (= 100% of parish)

- ~ All Parish Council members, Ministry Leaders and Clergy are Ambassadors
- ~ Train all Ambassadors on how and what to solicit (the focus is time and talents engagement)

Stewardship Campaigns

Communications Matter!

- 1. Annual, year-long stewardship campaign
- 2. Monthly stewardship articles in ALL Parish publications (Scripture + testimonials)
- 3. At least quarterly stewardship presentations
 - a. clergy AND lay testimonials
 - b. focus on life changing ministries (not problems) "people give to mission and vision"
 - c. emphasize time and talents ministry engagement
 - d. explain easy online giving options
 - e. emphasize tithing and % giving in each message
 - f. explain the incredible ministries that could be funded if everyone tithed

Stewardship Communications

Communications Matter!

4. Specific stewardship campaign month (sometime in Sept - Nov)

- a. Personal contacts
 - <u>Plan A</u> personal in-home visits
 - <u>Plan B</u> group gatherings
 - Plan C personal telephone calls
- a. Hand deliver stewardship packets for return to confidential place
- b. Conduct a separate youth stewardship campaign
- c. Focus on Ministry information and recruitment
- d. Host a "Ministry Fair" and have ministries share their great accomplishments and recruit
- e. Personal follow up to reach 100% participation
- f. Celebrate successes

February	- 1 st Adult Lay Testimonial
<u>March</u>	- Life-changing Ministry Presentation
<u>April</u>	- 2 nd Stewardship Homily
<u>May</u>	- Youth Testimonial
<u>June</u>	 Stewardship Materials Preparations
<u>July</u>	- 3rd Stewardship Homily
<u>August</u>	- Young Adult Testimonial - Ministry Fair
<u>September</u> -Adult & Youth Campaign & Personal Visits	
<u>October</u>	- Follow-up Visits/Calls To Get To 100%
<u>Novembe</u>	<u>r</u> - 4 th Stewardship Homily - Results Reported

- 6. Thank and celebrate






