

The Problem With Dues?

Dictionary Definition of Dues: "charges for membership in a club or organization"

1. Christ taught the opposite of dues

Christ explained our stewardship obligation

= 100% in the parable of the Rich Young Man (Matthew 19:16-22)

= 50% + 4x what was taken ≈ 100% in the parable of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10)

The Problem With Dues?

3. Membership dues create entitlement benefits and are given with expectations because "<u>it's my</u> money"

Payer gives for recognition and not out of gratitude and humility

Payer uses money to claim a "right" to determine all church spending

Payer withhold funds when they don't get what they want (and tries to convince others to do likewise)

4. Funds are given from what's left not "first fruits"

Tithing of all 3 Ts

Tithing (percentage giving) of Time, Talents and Treasures is called for by Holy Scripture and can make a significant positive difference





¹ The *Didascalia Apostolorum*, is a Christian legal treatise belonging to the genre of the Church Orders. It presents itself as being written by the <u>Twelve Apostles</u> at the time of the <u>Council of Jerusalem</u>; however, scholars agree that it was actually a composition of the <u>3rd century</u>, perhaps around <u>230 AD</u>




Tithing Is Not Just An Old Testament Thing



"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law and Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill" (Matthew 5:17)

"Woe to you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay <u>tithe</u> of mint and anise and cummin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith. <u>These</u> <u>you ought to have done without</u> <u>leaving the others undone</u>" "Stewardship is recommended to be <u>ten</u> <u>percent (10%)</u> of one's annual income as stated in Holy Scripture to help meet the financial obligations of the Parish, the Metropolis and the Archdiocese"



Uniform Parish Regulations

Article 18, Section 1 of the Regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America Tithing should be your goal.

A <u>minimum</u> of 10% Time, Talent <u>and</u> Treasures.

("You shall tithe..." Deuteronomy 14:22)



U.S. Tithing Data¹

- ~ GOA proxy median tithe analysis² shows we give
 ≈ 0.5 to 0.7% (rather than 10%)
- ~ 77% of tithers give more than 10%
- ~ 70% of tithers base it on their gross income



1. Teach tithing & % giving

- 2. Share the impact and lives improved

You must totally flip the parish culture and overcome generations of teaching deficiencies



- 1. Teach tithing & percentage giving
 - ~ You have to teach the WHY and history of the tithe
 - ~ You have to start teaching it monthly for at least a year
 - ~ Teaching includes homilies, articles, Sunday School lessons, adult classes, stories and testimonials



2. Share the impact and lives improved

~ Provide specific examples of how tithes changed people' lives

~ Actual stories of people helped and higher percentages of impact are most effective

~ Testimonials from recipients and tithers / percentage givers make a big impact

- 3. Leaders Lead By Example
 - ~ "Your actions speak so loudly, I can't hear what you're saying."
 - ~ Clergy, Parish Council, and Ministry Leaders must show their leadership commitment
 - ~ Tithing and percentage giving must become a criteria for selecting and promoting leaders (like church attendance)

4. Use The Roundup

- ~ Calculate the % of last year's income you gave to your church to 1 decimal point (e.g., 0.5%)
- ~ This year, "round up" your gift to the next highest whole number percent of income (e.g., 1%)
- ~ Next year add 1% more
- ~ Add 1% a year until you reach 10% (or more)

How Much Due I Owe?

HOW MUCH DO I OWE? By Bill Marianes¹

"How much do I owe" asked the parishioner. "For what?" I asked. "You know, for my church dues." I truly did not know what to say next, so I asked a simple question. "How much have you been blessed? "A lot" they said, "but what has that got to do with anything? I just want to know how much of my money I have to give to the church as dues to be a member?"

And that was when I finally realized that, among other things, they got the pronoun wrong. They weren't really dealing with "their" assets. They are all "His" (i.e., God's). They failed to understand that Christ's church does not sell "memberships" or charge "dues" and that everything "they" had was really a gift from God, their Father. Everything! Their life, their talents, their genetic composition, their life experiences, the people who loved them, the opportunities presented them for greatness, the chances to make a difference in the world, their stuff and even their money. None of it was really theirs. They were merely a temporary steward (caretaker) of God's gifts. They didn't get it and just wanted me to give them a magic number as if it were written in some golden tablets.


So I replied with what Christ taught us on the subject: "Give it all, I said." In Matthew 19:16-21 we are presented with parable of the young man who asked Christ. "What good dead must I do to have eternal life?" The young man was focused on the right thing, namely eternal life, and not some temporary success, job promotion or nice lifestyle. Christ responded by essentially first reviewing the 10 Commandments and then gave the following clear guidance: "If you would be perfect, go sell what you possess and give it to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; and come follow me."

Notice what Christ said. "If you would be <u>perfect</u>..." Perfect, he said, not average, or in the 2nd quartile. The roadmap to perfection is to give back everything we have been given. How many of us are ready to go "all in" and take the journey down that path toward an ultimate goal that is more rich and fulfilling than anything we could imagine? The young man was not ready, and "...he went avery sad."

Paradoxically, it is kind of funny, because eventually we will give everything. When we die (on this earth) we will not take any of our stuff with us. You still never see a hearse followed by a U-Haul trailer. So why not give it now and experience the joy that comes from helping someone else. Or would you prefer to also "go away sad."

An endless number of Scripture passages make it clear that our obligation of stewardship over God's many gifts to us is to give in proportion to the blessings we have received. Indeed the Parable of Talents from Matthew 25:14-30 is all about taking whatever gifts God gives us, putting them out into the world and causing them to multiply, and then giving them back in proportion to what we earned in order to receive the reward of hearing. "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much."

1st Corinthians 9:7 teaches us: "So let each one give as he purposeth in his heart, not grudgingly or out of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver." Note the emphasis on cheerful giving, not




