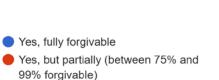

Was the relief provided by the Metropolis in 2021 helpful to your budget? ⁵⁶ responses

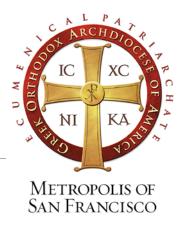


Did your parish experience increases in financial stewardship in 2020 and do you expect that to continue or grow in 2021? ⁵⁶ responses

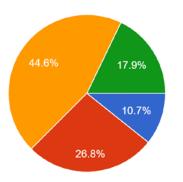

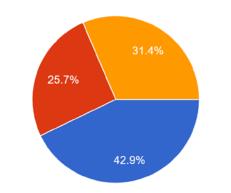


Do you plan to hold a festival in 2021? 56 responses

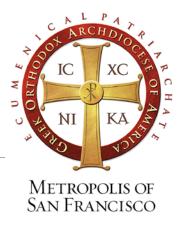

If you answered "no" to the prior question, do you plan to hold a festival in 2022? 35 responses

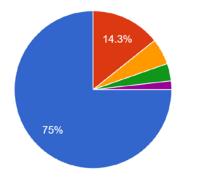

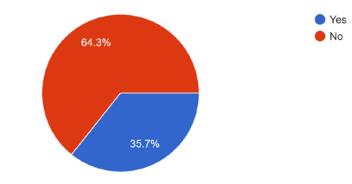
In light of all prior questions, what is your estimated Archdiocesan Allocation payment expectation for 2021?

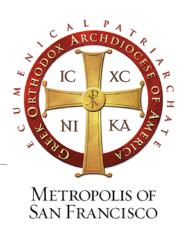

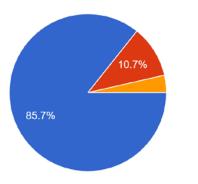

Are reserve funds being used, or anticipated to be used, to make the TC payments in 2021? ⁵⁶ responses



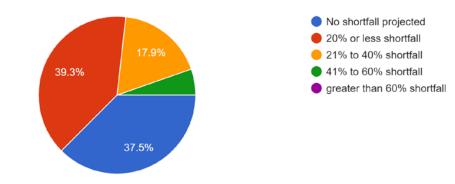


Excluding TC payments, and taking the prior discussed funding options into account, is your parish expected to be in financial difficulty overall? ⁵⁶ responses

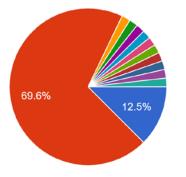
After taking all of the preceding funding sources and TC payments into consideration, what is your projected budget shortfall in 2021? ⁵⁶ responses





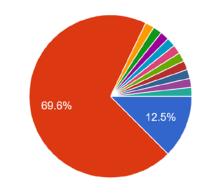

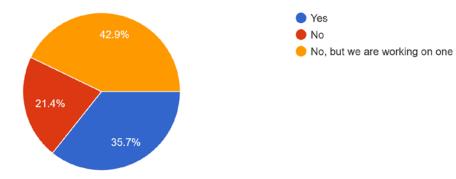

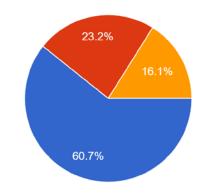

Does the parish have a documented plan to address the primary concern raised above? ⁵⁶ responses



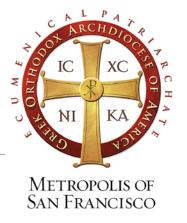

Total Commitment – 2022 Status

2022 TC exercise has been completed and peer review has taken place (Detroit)

- 2 parishes did not provide submissions 10% increase over prior year as a result
- No change to TC in 2022, although changes to individual parishes:
 - > 15 parishes will experience reductions
 - 16 parishes will remain flat
 - > 28 parishes will experience increases

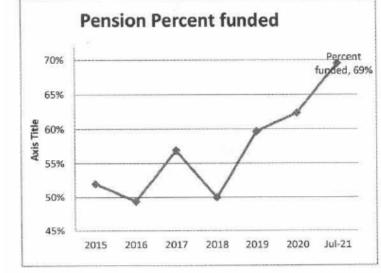

Pension Benefits Funding - 2021

- Program has exceeded expectations; payments are being made timely and by more parishes
- > San Francisco is only Metropolis to have payments made by all participating parishes
- Parish contributions are funding current and future benefits, not past unfunded amounts. The pension plan is healthy and performing well!

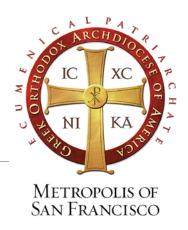

Pension Benefits Funding - 2022

- 2020 Clergy-Laity Congress approved increase to benefits funding equal to 3% of 2021 TC budget; translates to \$665,618 increase for 2022 across Archdiocese
- San Francisco increase of \$97,939 based on table shown
- Why 6% increase from 2021 including cushion vs. more or less for other Metropolises?
 - Function of amount of cushion built into calculations
 - Function of number of parishes, number of clergy, amount of TC per parish
- Pension benefit funding will be a TC deduction in 2022 for 2023 TC allocations

New Pension Benefits Funding Process - FAQ

What is the "pension benefits funding" process?

2020 and prior, every participating parish contributed \$700/month/priest (\$8,400/year) to the Archdiocesan defined benefit pension plan; this flat contribution was replaced with an allocation approach as of 2021.

What was wrong with the prior approach?

The flat approach did not allocate benefits funding in an equitable fashion. Smaller, less financially strong, parishes have been providing a greater share over larger parishes with greater financial abilities by contributing the same monthly amount.

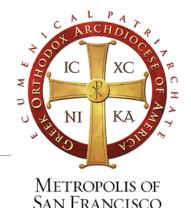
How does the allocation work again?

The new approach as of 2021 bases the Metropolis pension allocation on the unfunded pension liability of our Metropolis as a whole (in relation to the entire Archdiocese) and the proportion of current year costs for admin and benefits costs based on pensionable earnings for plan participants of the Metropolis as related to the whole of the Archdiocese.



New Pension Benefits Funding Process - FAQ

How will these Metropolis allocations be distributed to parishes?



- Each parish will be allocated: (1) a flat \$1,500 per participant to cover annual plan admin and ancillary benefit costs;
 (2) an allocation of the overall Metropolis benefit allocation applied as a percentage of TC, which covers the balance of ancillary benefit costs, current year pension costs, and a portion of the unfunded pension liability.
- Parish results are being reviewed by the Metropolis Finance Committee, our Chancellor, and our Metropolitan. Proposed allocations will be sent back to joint task force 10/22; joint task force will align across entire Archdiocese and send final numbers back to Metropolises by 10/31; Metropolis will provide allocations to parishes the week of 11/1; an appeal process will be made available, the same as within the TC process.

So the parishes are on the hook for the past decisions of the Archdiocese, right?

- The Archbishop has committed to fundraising or finding major donors to address the \$65+ million unfunded liability. This allocation process is not intended to address all of that and it would have happened regardless of whether the plan was underfunded, flat, or overfunded. The allocation process makes the pension benefit funding going forward more equitable across parishes.
- There is a small component of the allocation that addresses the unfunded component because we have a fiduciary responsibility to "stop the clock" and not make the underfunding any larger and to try to even reduce it if possible.
